# Weekly policy update from London Chamber of Commerce and Industry

A round-up of key policy changes from the past seven days - 7 May 2024

### Sadig Khan wins third term – local elections round-up

- Labour Party candidate Sadiq Khan has been re-elected as Mayor of London, beating his main rival Susan Hall (Conservatives). The full results of the Mayoral election can be found <a href="here">here</a>, and below are the top five candidates:
  - Labour, Sadiq Khan: 43.8% (up 3.8 pp from 2021)
  - o Conservative, Susan Hall: 32.7% (down 2.6 pp from 2021)
  - o Liberal Democrat, Rob Blackie: 5.8% (up 1.4 pp from 2021)
  - o Green Party, Zoë Garbutt: 5.8% (down 2.0 pp from 2021)
  - o Reform Party, Howard Cox: 3.2%
- LCCI's Chief Executive Karim Fatehi MBE <u>congratulated</u> Sadiq Khan on his re-election, stating: "Now is the time for the Mayor to embrace London's business community, discuss our shared concerns, and develop a long-term strategic plan to ensure the best possible operating conditions to unlock productivity and economic growth."
- In the London Assembly, the Labour Party remained the largest party with 11 seats. The breakdown of the London Assembly seats are below:
  - Labour Party: 11 (unchanged from 2021)
  - Conservative Party: 8 (-1)
  - Green Party: 3 (unchanged)
  - Liberal Democrat: 2 (unchanged)

- Outside of London, there were local elections in several areas, as well as Mayoral elections. In the local council elections, Labour secured additional seats while the Conservatives suffered heavy losses:
  - Labour: +232 councillors, and gained control of 8 councils
  - o Conservatives: -397 councillors, and lost control of 10 councils
  - Liberal Democrat: +98 councillors, and gained control of 2 councils
  - o Green Party: +64 councillors
- Labour also secured victory in every Mayoral election in England bar Tees Valley, including ousting Andy Street as West Midlands Mayor. These election results can be viewed <a href="here">here</a>.

### New plans to drive carbon capture industry forward

- The Government has <u>launched</u> a call for evidence for new options for transporting CO2, on top of the existing network of pipelines.
- Carbon capture technology works by capturing CO2 before it reaches the atmosphere, storing it
  underground in offshore sites. The Climate Change Committee has described the technology
  as a necessity for meeting net zero targets.

## £1.8 million for technology to decarbonise freight

- Roads Minister Guy Opperman has announced £1.8 million in funding to deliver technologies to decarbonise freight, as part of the Freight Innovation Fund.
